



CLIMATE POSITIVE CHARTER.

Sometime after the international community put environmental devastation on the agenda, a group of leaders and organizations from different cultures and sectors promoted by the [United Nations](#), participated in the drafting of an international declaration that affirms that the protection of the environment, human rights, egalitarian development, and peace are interdependent and indivisible. Since 2000, this document – the “[Earth Charter](#)” - has been a guiding instrument for governments, organizations, communities, and/or individuals.

[Mr Mikhail Gorbachev](#), one of the leaders of the Earth Charter, founder of [Green Cross International](#), and Nobel Peace Prize winner, once said “... the future is not predetermined, it depends on what humanity does today, it is urgent to go from talking to acting to save the environment, under a Perestroika - reconstruction - sustainable based on Glasnost - transparency -...”.

In the current geopolitical conjuncture, where countries commit to net zero emissions by 2050, the vision of the political leader that ended the Cold War, and the validity of the Earth Charter, have served as a basis and inspiration to formulate, solve, develop and execute the principle of Climate Positive, a perspective through which addressing holistically the pillars of sustainable development following these axioms:

1. Make the natural world the role model.
2. Make the common good a generous virtue.
3. Make an equitable distribution of the value

“Climate Positive” stems from the strong conviction that Perestroika begins with the positive lead of the State with the adequate implementation of the [SDG17](#); where Glasnost must contribute to transforming the global market by promoting a responsible private sector that complies with the ten principles established in the [United Nations Global Compact](#).

"Climate Positive" promotes the generation of a mobilizing force, appealing to the analytical capacity of the individual and the social awareness of change, which allows reversing the deep environmental, economic and social crisis that mankind has generated.

“Climate Positive” suggests that no one can save oneself alone, that science and technology are necessary but not sufficient, and that decentralized empowerment of communities is essential, generating a vision based on the ethics of the common good and sustainable responsibility in solidarity with the environment.

“Climate Positive” offers a path towards the evolution of human behaviour, in pursuit of a fairer world that recovers and preserves biodiversity to avoid a potential sixth extinction.

“Climate Positive” proposes to mitigate/remediate/compensate the environmental footprints and address the Human Impact in its entirety, face the new challenges that Global Change implies, and invest in the adaptation that it entails, without neglecting



the commitment to the non-proliferation of nuclear weapons and the eradication of nuclear and chemical weapons.

“Climate Positive” emphasizes the final words of the Earth Charter - “... may ours be a time to be remembered for the awakening of a new reverence for life, the firm resolve to achieve sustainability, the acceleration in the fight for justice and peace and for the joyous celebration of life”.
